Some resource persons included Dr. Obelebra Adeniyi and Dr. (Prof.) Chizindu Alikor, Dr. Ebbi Robinson.

There were several sessions across different key themes required to deliver a purposeful and successful term. Some of the themes explored during the retreat include; Vision for the Future, Leadership Development, Collaboration and Team Building, Strategic Planning, Wellness and balance, Networking and connection. The meeting also provided an opportunity for the first State Officers Committee (SOC) and all SOC members filled out their asset declaration forms



NMA Holds First National Executive Council Meeting Under Dr. (Prof.) Bala M. Audu, Highlights Critical Health Sector Issues

The Nigerian Medical Association (NMA), under the leadership of Dr. (Prof.) Bala M. Audu, convened its first National Executive Council (NEC) meeting at the University of Maiduguri Teaching Hospital (UMTH) in Borno State. The event, held from August 20th to 23rd, 2024, brought together key stakeholders to address pressing issues in the nation's healthcare sector.

The Rivers State delegation, led by Dr. Diamond Tamunokuro, Chairman of the NMA Rivers State Branch, actively participated in the discussions that shaped the meeting's resolutions.

The central theme of the meeting, "Looking Inwards: The Role of Government and Health Institutions in Curbing Health

Tourism," set the tone for a series of critical deliberations. Held at the UMTH auditorium and conference centre, the NEC meeting culminated in 12 key observations and 13 resolutions to enhance Nigeria's healthcare landscape. One of the most pressing matters discussed was the call to implement the National Policy on Health Workforce

Migration fully. Delegates underscored the urgent need to curb the brain drain in the medical sector by expanding non-remuneration incentives and enhancing welfare packages and remuneration for healthcare professionals. The NMA also advocated for a universal approach to implementing the Consolidated Medical Salary Structure (CONMESS) to prevent an

internal migration crisis among doctors and other healthcare workers.

The NMA commended the recent Supreme Court judgment on local government autonomy, expressing hope that it would open avenues to revitalise the primary health sector. The security situation in the country was another focal point, with the NMA urging security agencies to intensify efforts to secure the release of kidnapped medical professionals across Nigeria. They stressed the dire need to protect healthcare workers who risk their lives daily to provide essential services.

In a bid to strengthen the local healthcare system, the NMA appealed to the Federal Government to reduce electricity tariffs for health institutions, thereby boosting local capacity and reducing operational costs. The association also called for collaboration with the Ministry of Health to improve data collection on non-communicable diseases, which remains a critical

component of national health planning and policy. In a related development following the meeting, 19 medical students and one doctor who were kidnapped in Benue State have been released, along with Dr. Olufunke Fadahunsi. However, the NMA expressed concern for Dr. Ganiyat Olawale-Popoola and Dr. Austin Uwumagbe, who have been held captive for over eight and eleven months, respectively, and remain missing. The association renewed its appeal to security forces and the government to expedite their safe return. The federal government has also announced a 50% waiver of electricity tariffs for public and private health facilities.

The NEC meeting underscored the NMA's commitment to advocating for policies that protect and empower healthcare professionals while enhancing the overall health sector. The

association remains resolute in its mission to ensure that Nigerian doctors and health institutions receive the support and security necessary to deliver quality healthcare to all citizens



NMA Rivers State and Rivers State Ministry of Health Intensify Anti-Quackery Measures: Two Health Facilities Shut Down

On August 19, 2024, the Rivers State Ministry of Health, in collaboration with the Nigerian Medical Association (NMA) Rivers State, held a press briefing to announce their intensified efforts against quackery in the healthcare sector. The briefing highlighted a renewed commitment to combating illegal medical practices across the state. During the briefing, the State Commissioner of Health, Dr. Adaeze Oreh, announced the recent closure of two health facilities that were found to be operating beyond their scope of training and without the required approvals. This action forms part of a broader campaign to crack down on unregistered and unregulated medical practices to protect the health of citizens living and working in Rivers State.

Representatives from the Ministry of Health and the NMA Rivers State Chairman, Dr Diamond Tamunokuro, emphasised their determination to eradicate quackery and ensure that healthcare services in the state meet the highest standards. The initiative, they noted, is driven by the principle that "Rivers lives matter," underscoring their resolve to ensure no room for quackery remains in the state. They warned that no individual, Local Government Area, or unauthorised practice would be spared in the ongoing fight against illegal medical activities.

The officials urged all healthcare practitioners to adhere to the state's regulations. They advised practitioners to obtain yearly practising licenses to continue offering services legally and operate strictly within their expertise's limits. Practitioners were cautioned against providing medical services in unregistered health facilities. They were reminded of the need to secure permission from the Office of the Director of Medical Services before conducting medical outreaches.

Furthermore, all private practice facilities must be registered with the Rivers State Ministry of Health (RSMOH) and the Association of Nigerian Private Medical Practitioners (ANPMP).

The press briefing concluded with a solid call to action, urging medical professionals to comply with these guidelines as the state intensifies its efforts to eliminate quackery. The Ministry and NMA reiterated their zero-tolerance policy, promising to continue rigorous inspections and enforcement across all Local Government Areas. They emphasised that their commitment to protecting the lives of Rivers State residents is unwavering, with a firm declaration that no practitioner, facility, or unauthorised practice would be left unchecked in their renewed mission to safequard public health.

The NMA played a pivotal role in the discussions, contributing valuable technical insights to refine the bill.

The NMA's eight-member health sector delegation made substantial contributions during the hearing, presenting a detailed technical document to the Deputy Speaker of the House of Assembly. The association expressed hope that its expert recommendations would guide legislators in making crucial modifications to the bill before its third reading and eventual passage.

The delegation included a distinguished team of professionals: Dr. Diamond Tamunokuro (Chairman, NMA)

Rivers State), Dr. Osoma Smith (NMA State Secretary), Dr. Agiriye Agba Harry (Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Special Duties), Dr. Ojums Sylvanus (Director of Emergency Medical Services, Rivers State Ministry of Health), Dr. Ebbi Robinson (IPC), Dr. Edward Ikpea (Head of Department, Emergency Medicine, University of Port Harcourt Teaching Hospital), Dr. Hope Avundaa (IPS), and Dr. Ipalibo George (Former Member, RSHA). The NMA's participation underscores its commitment to shaping policies that enhance the state's emergency response framework. WHO Declares Mpox a Public Health Emergency of International Concern, Rivers State confirms two cases and prepared to handle the outbreak

On August 13, 2024, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the rise in mpox cases a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) following a meeting of the International Health Regulations (IHR) Emergency Committee. This declaration represents thehighest level of alarm under international health law. WHO Director-General, Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, convened the meeting to assess the global threat posed by ongoing mpox outbreaks, previously known as monkeypox. This decision aligned with the Africa Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), which had declared mpox a public health

emergency just 24 hours earlier. Mpox cases have surged across several African countries, including the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Burundi, Kenya, Rwanda, and Uganda. By mid-August, over 14,000 cases and 524 deaths had been reported, a significant increase from 2023. The emergence of highly transmissible and deadly clades, particularly clade 1b, has heightened concerns about further spread.

Dr. Tedros emphasised the need for a coordinated international response, highlighting the urgency of addressing outbreak drivers, enhancing surveillance, and implementing community-focused interventions.

regional response plan requiring \$15

million for immediate support, partially funded by \$1.45 million from the WHO Contingency Fund for Emergencies. Two WHO-approved vaccines are currently in use, with an Emergency Use Listing (EUL) initiated to boost vaccine production, especially for lower-income countries.

Standing recommendations under the IHR have been extended for another year to support countries in managing the ongoing risk of mpox. In Rivers State, the State Commissioner for Health, Dr. Adaeze Oreh, confirmed two cases on

August 20, 2024. The State Public Health Emergency Operations Center was activated, and training for ad-hoc staff began promptly. Infectious disease units in state and federal hospitals are prepared for active case management while tracking, monitoring, and screening efforts are underway, including at ports of entry. Plans are in place to upgrade existing PCR laboratories for faster testing. Infection prevention and control protocols have been distributed to hospitals, and practitioners are encouraged to use PPEs provided at these centres.


Dr. Tedros reiterated WHO's commitment to working with affected countries to curb transmission, treat the infected, and save lives as the world confronts this escalating health crisis.
